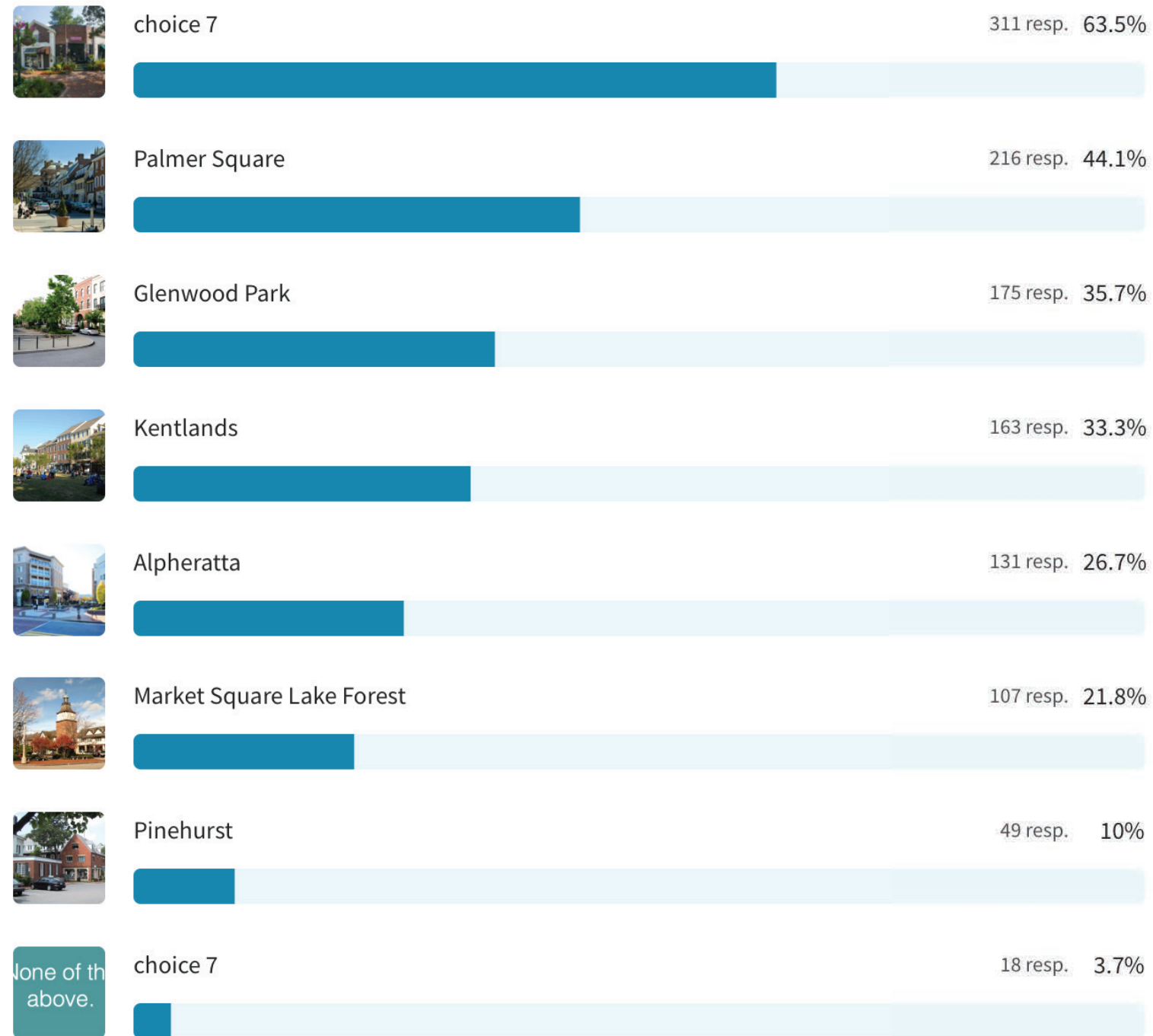


Below are **mixed-use** developments in similar-sized towns.

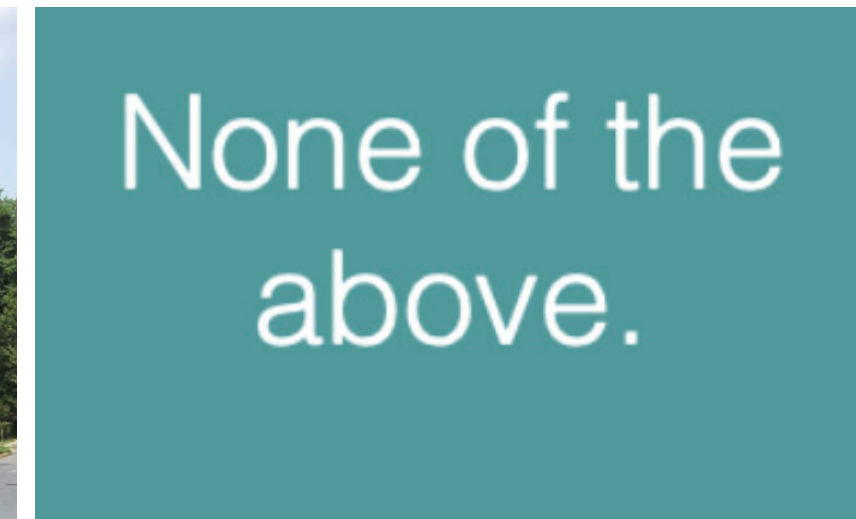
Top Three Choices



Observations

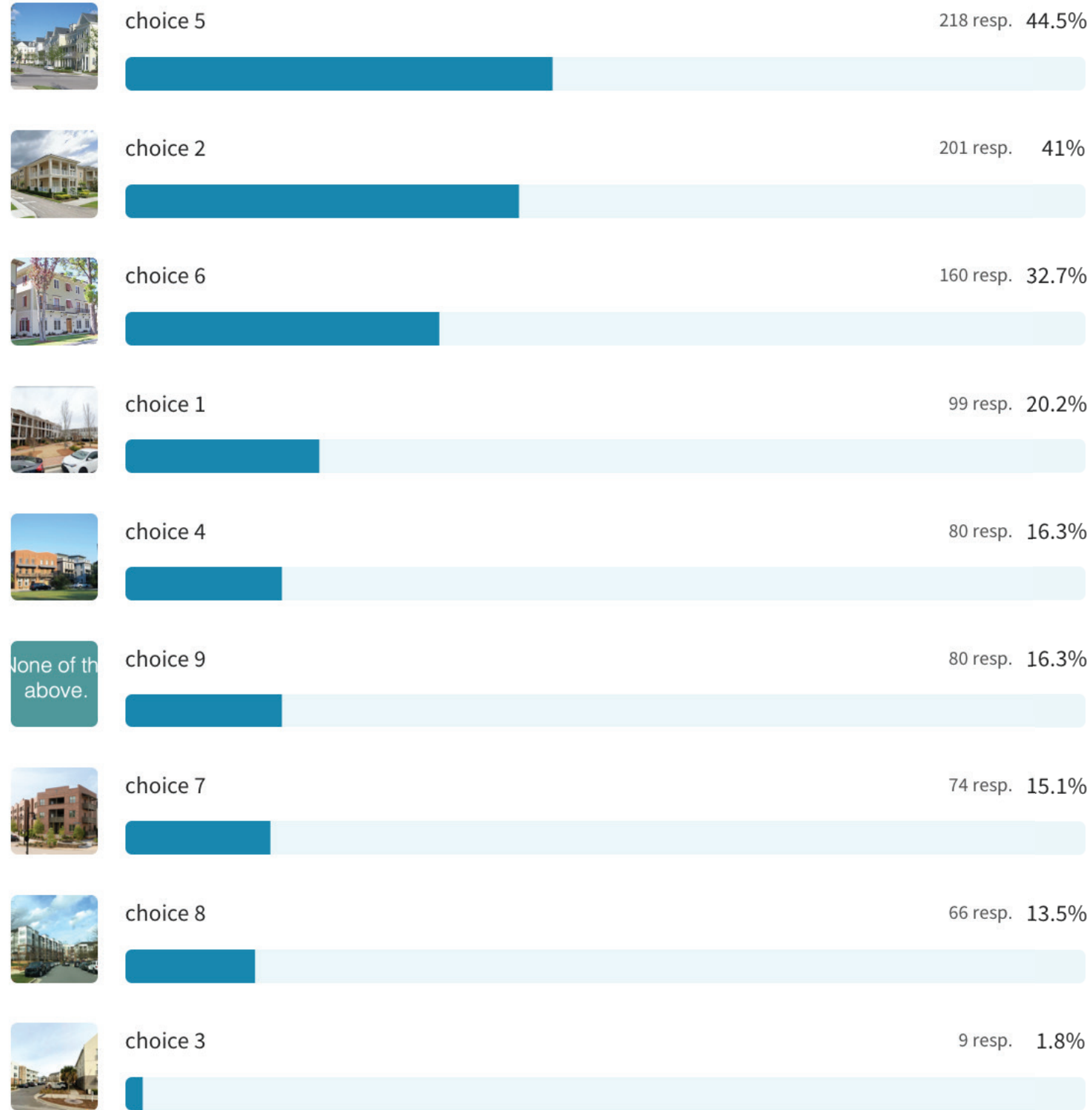
- one to three story buildings

- wide sidewalks, mature street trees and other landscaping that enhances/beautifies streets
- engaging ground floor retail with lots of glazing
- on-street parking is present next to retail shops
- special paving on sidewalks in select locations

Observations

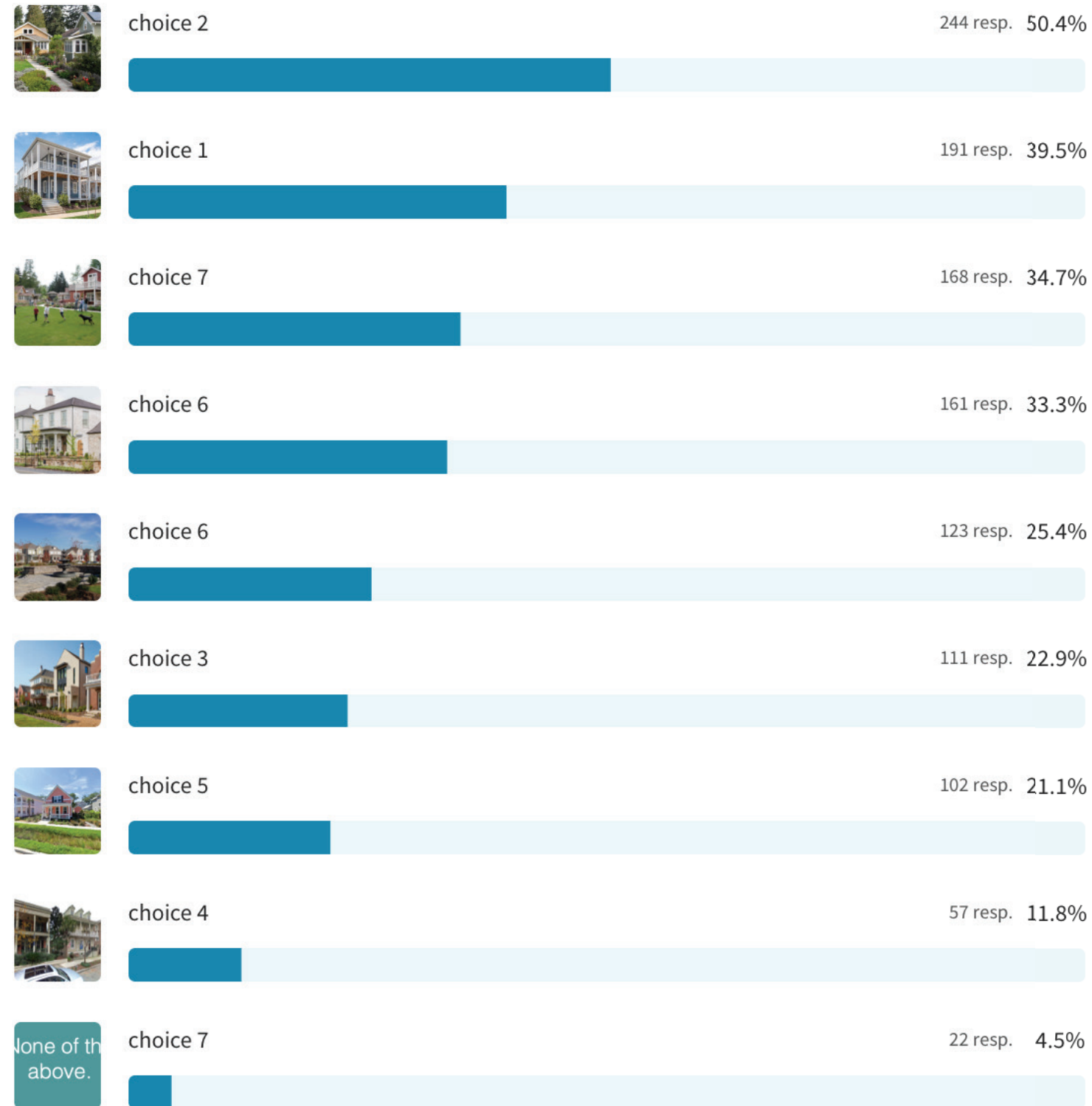
- two to three story buildings

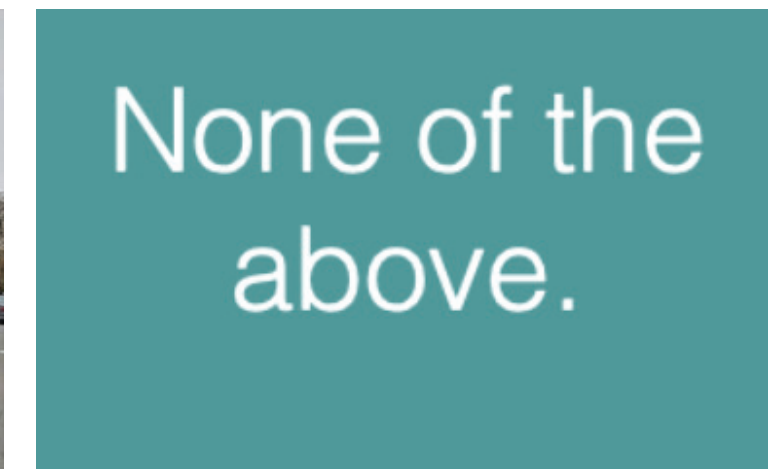
Top Three Choices

- architectural forms that respond to climate and architectural aesthetic of the region

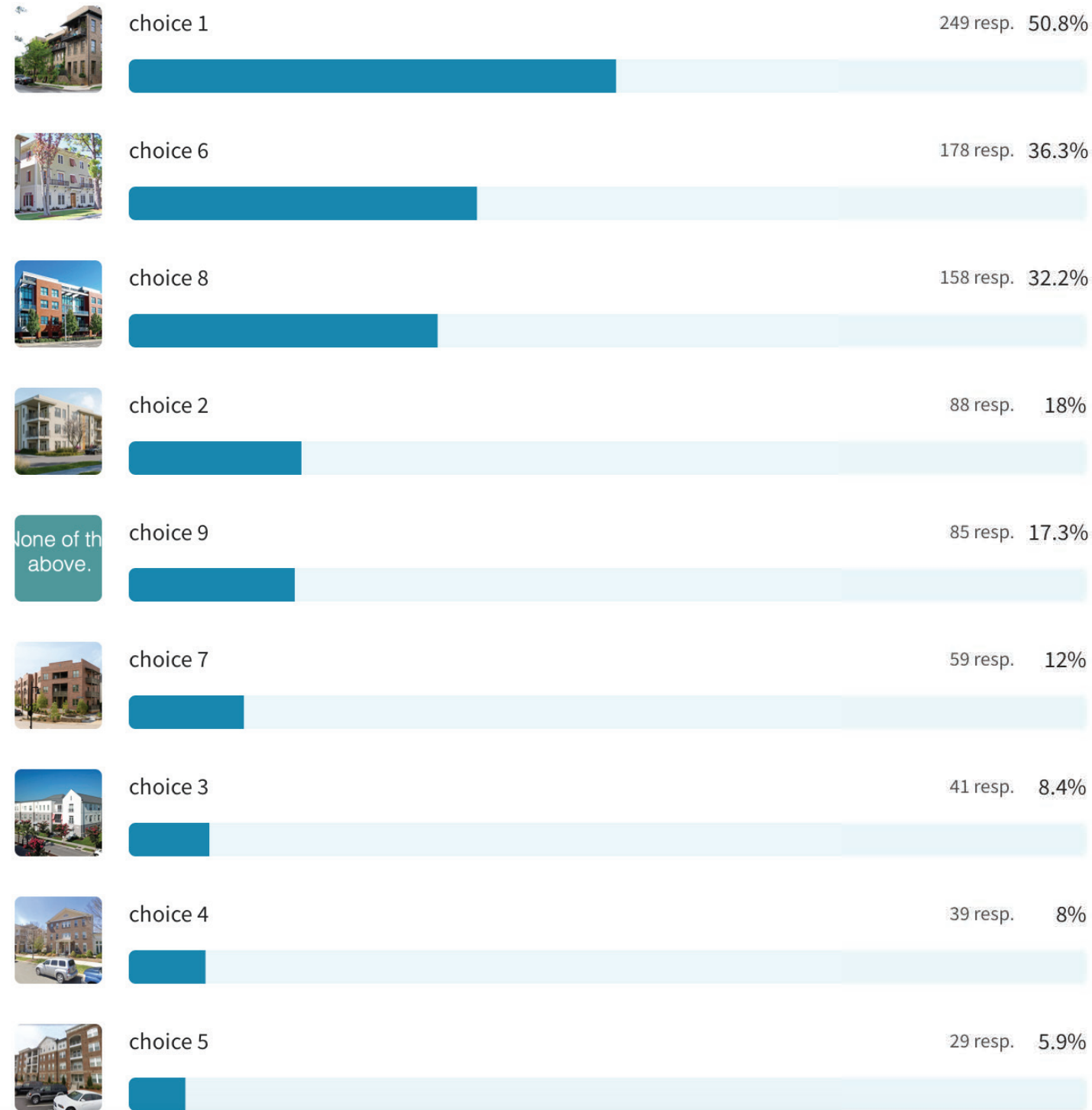

- mature street trees and well maintained landscaping

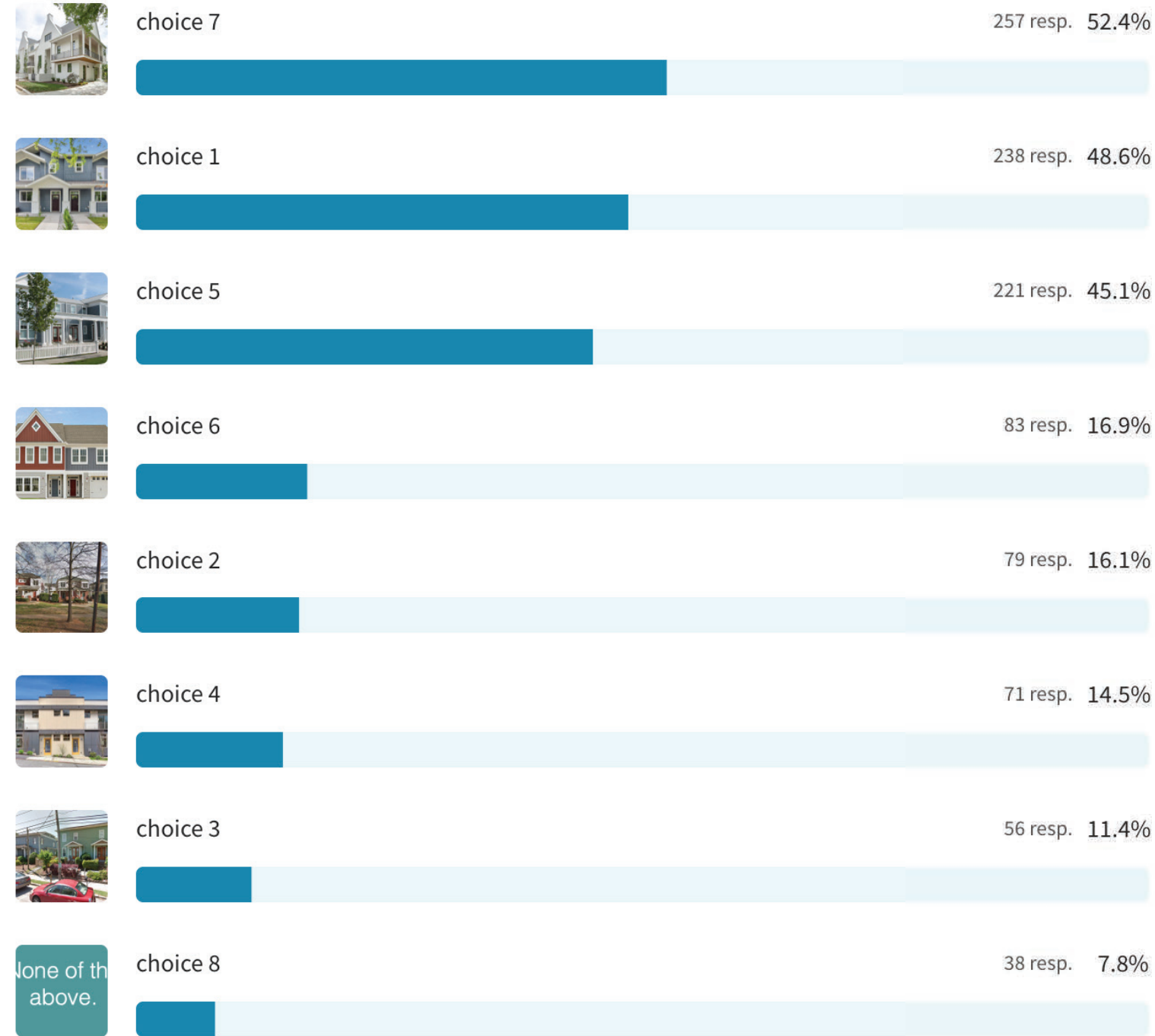

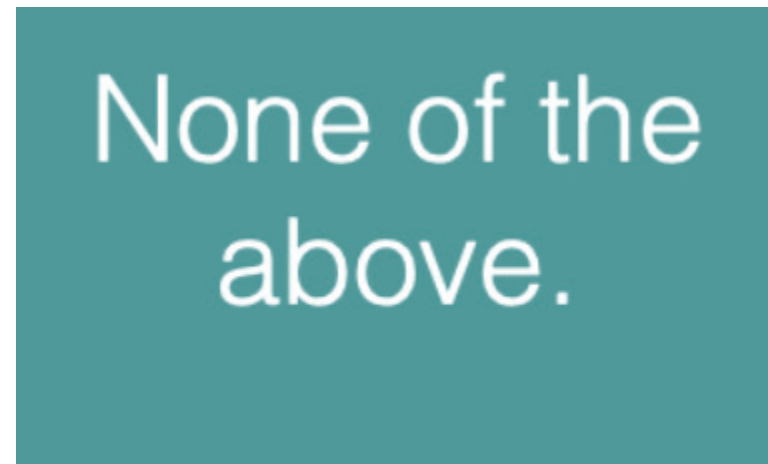
Top Three Choices

- material palette consists of siding and masonry

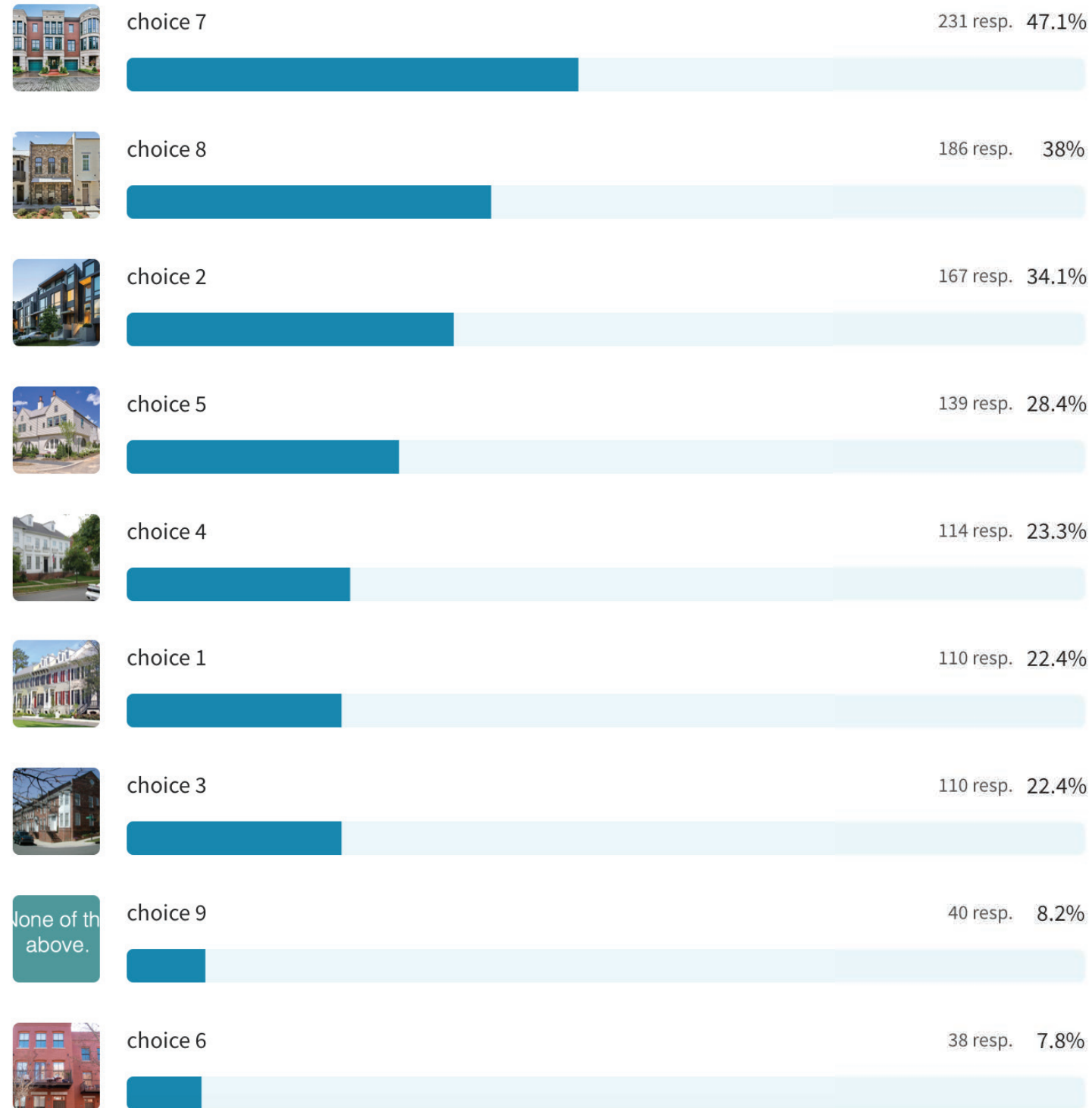

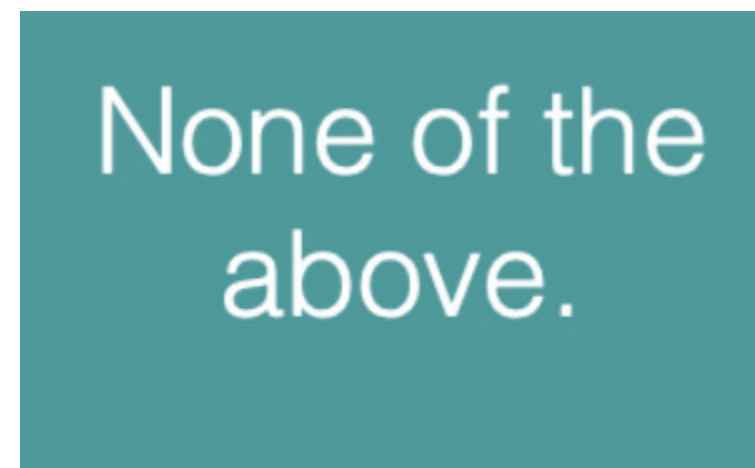
Top Three Choices



Observations

- masonry materials

- windows and doors that are well proportioned
- well maintained landscaping

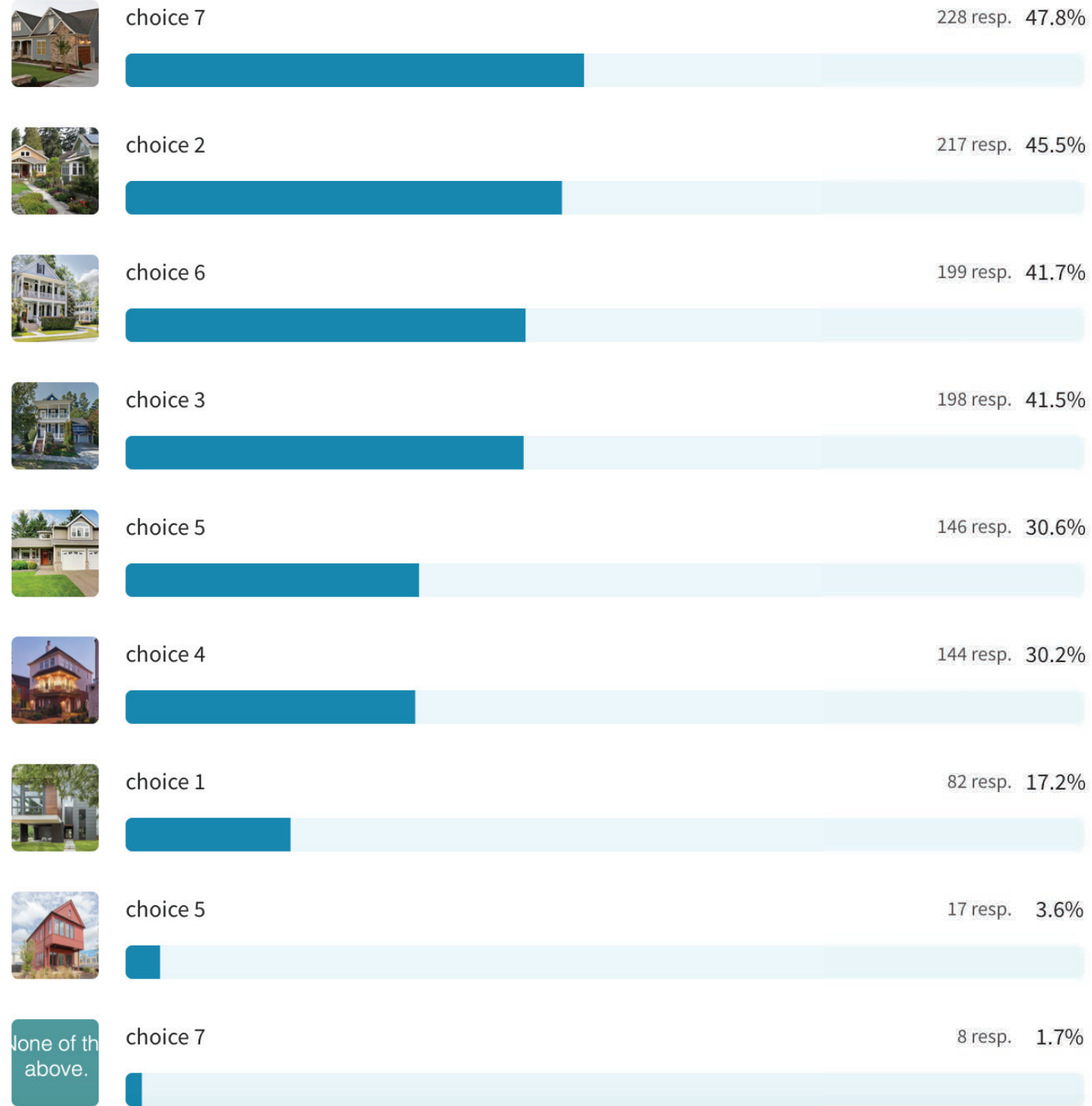

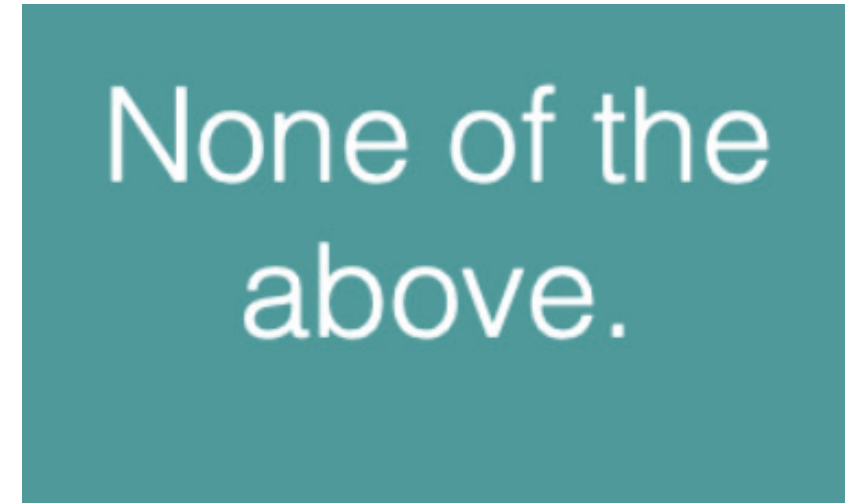

- architectural forms that respond to climate and architectural aesthetic of the region

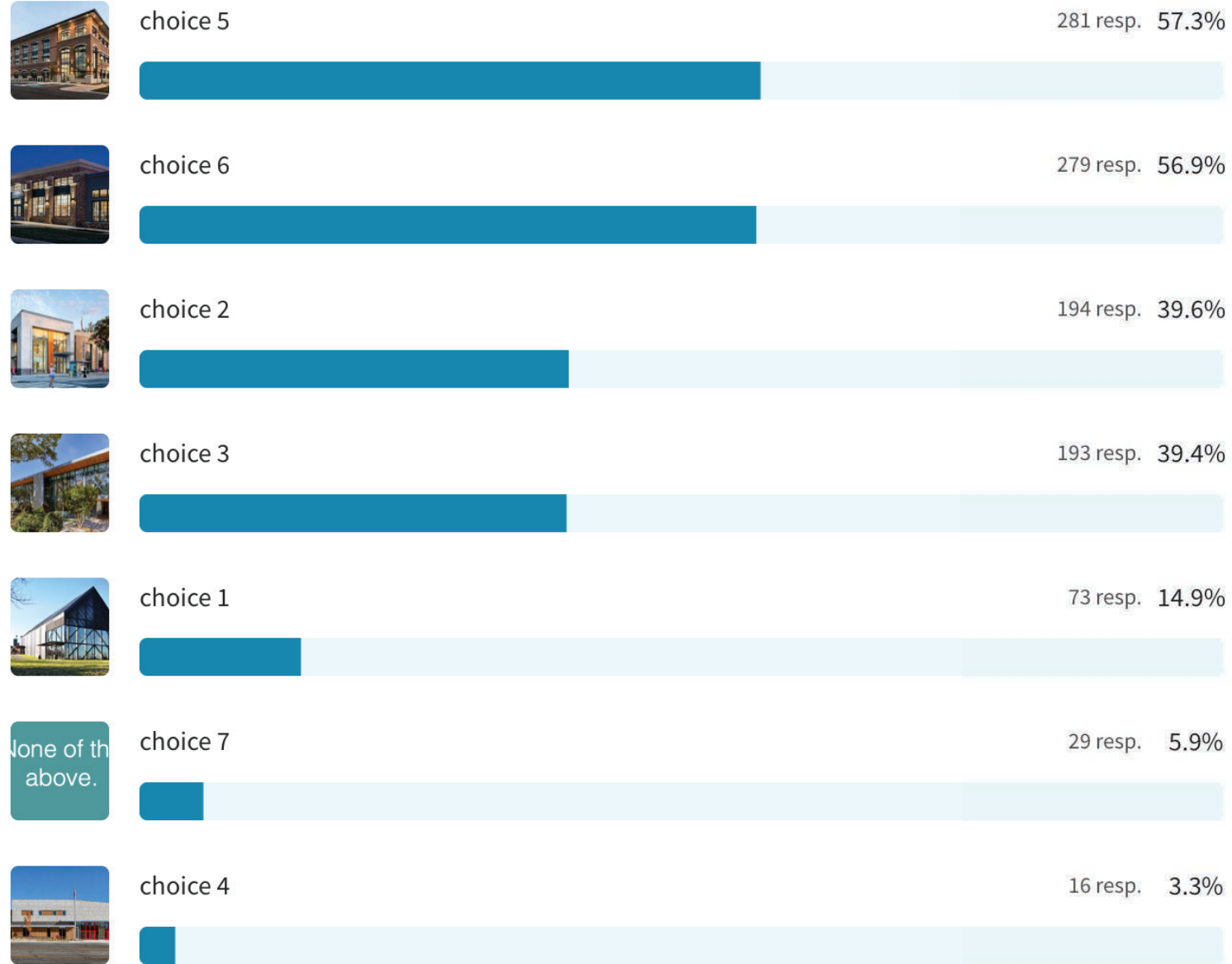

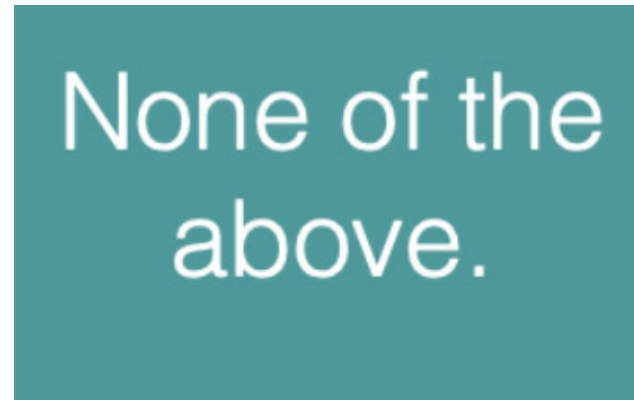
Top Three Choices

- sidewalks and outdoor furniture

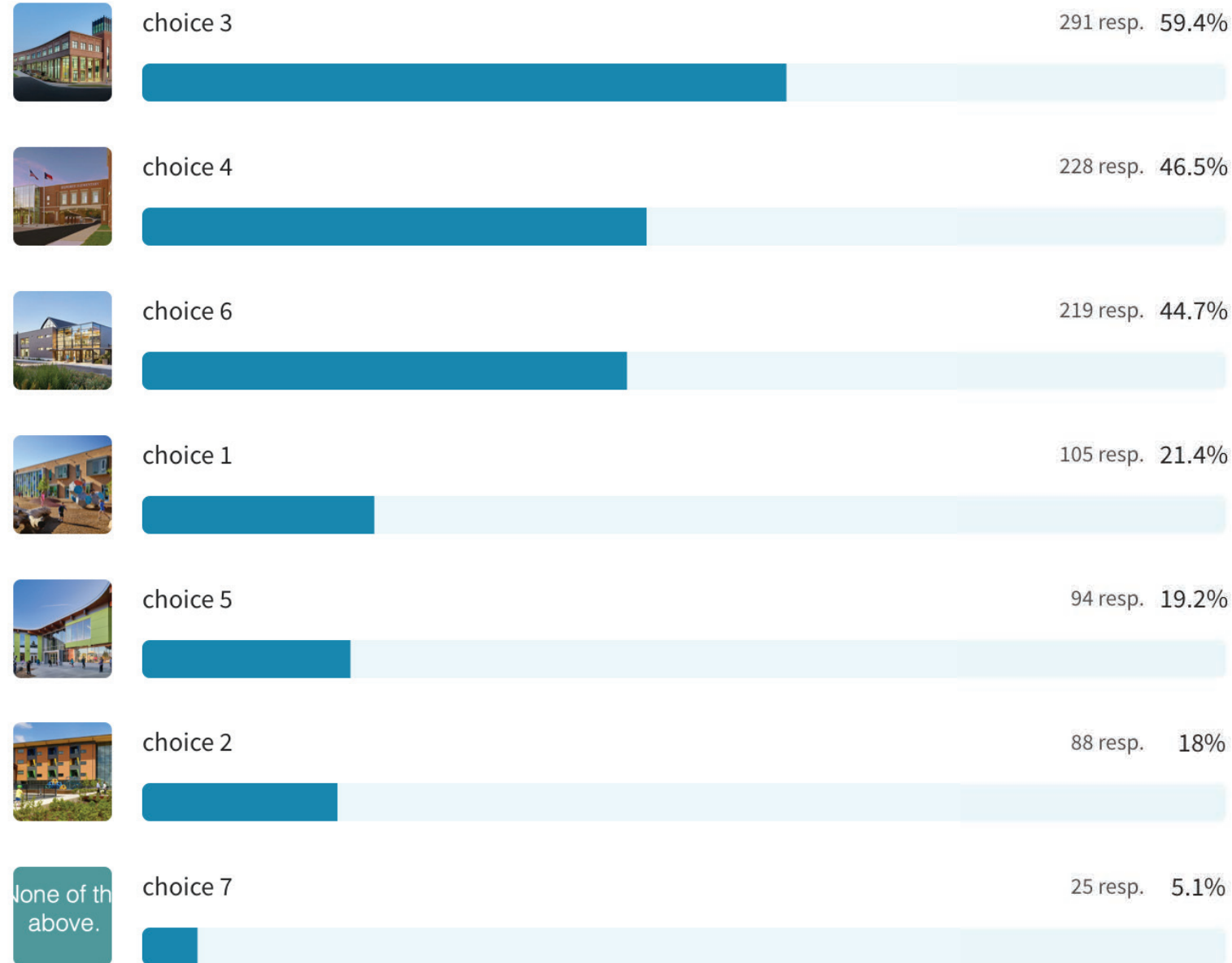

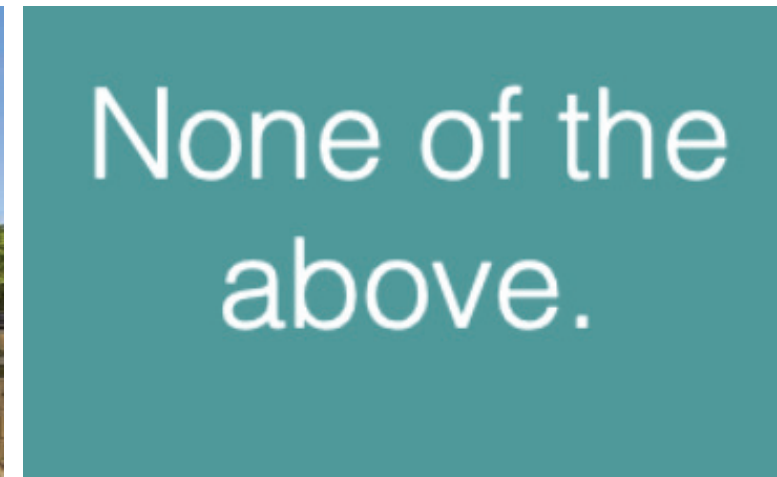
Top Three Choices

- mature trees and landscaping that is well maintained

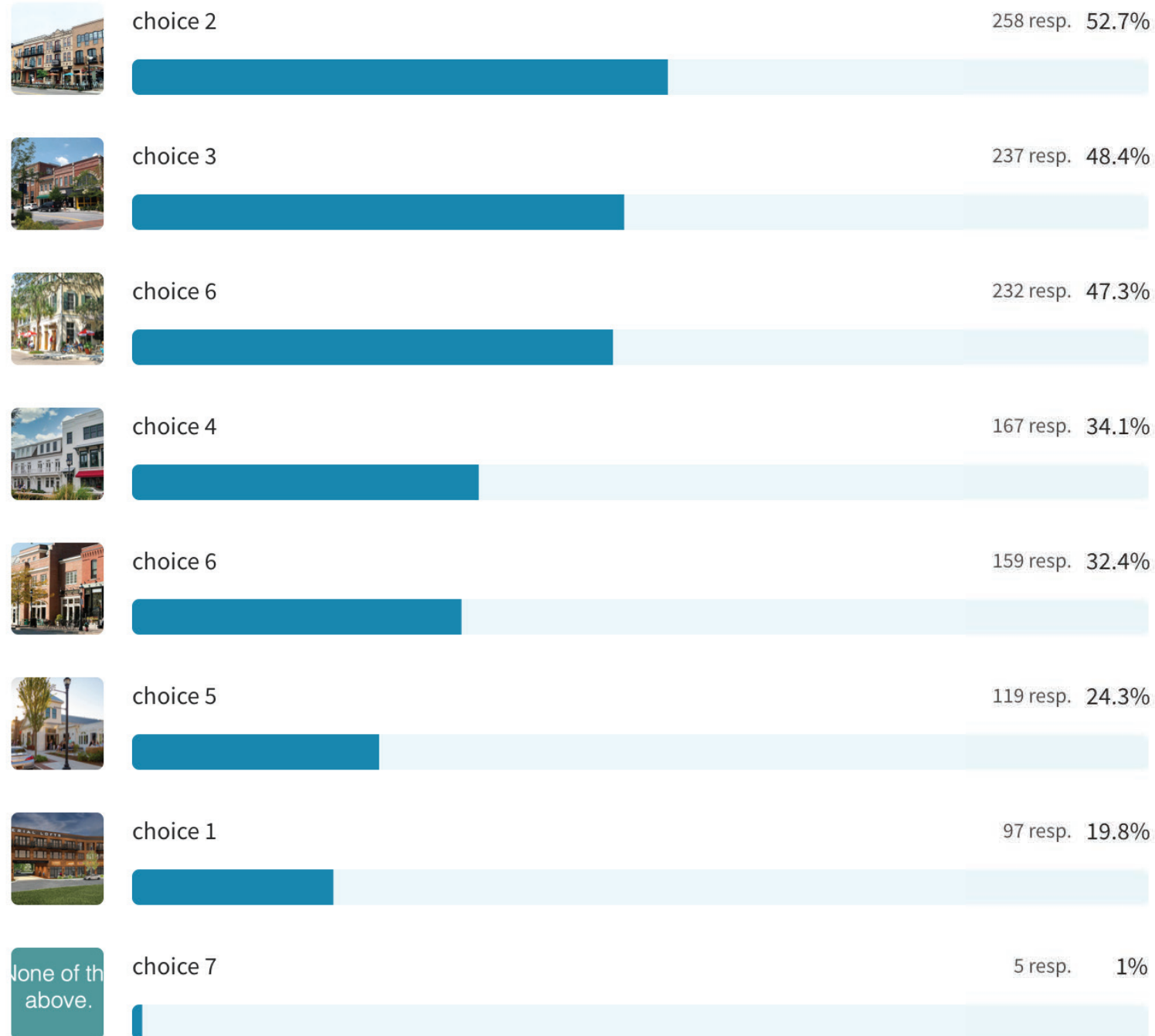

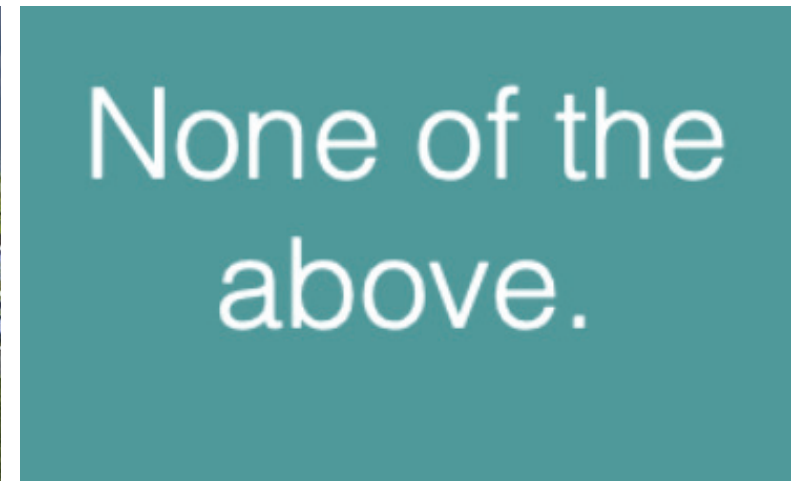
Top Three Choices



Observations

- on-street parking is present next to retail shops
- unique shop signs that identify each business

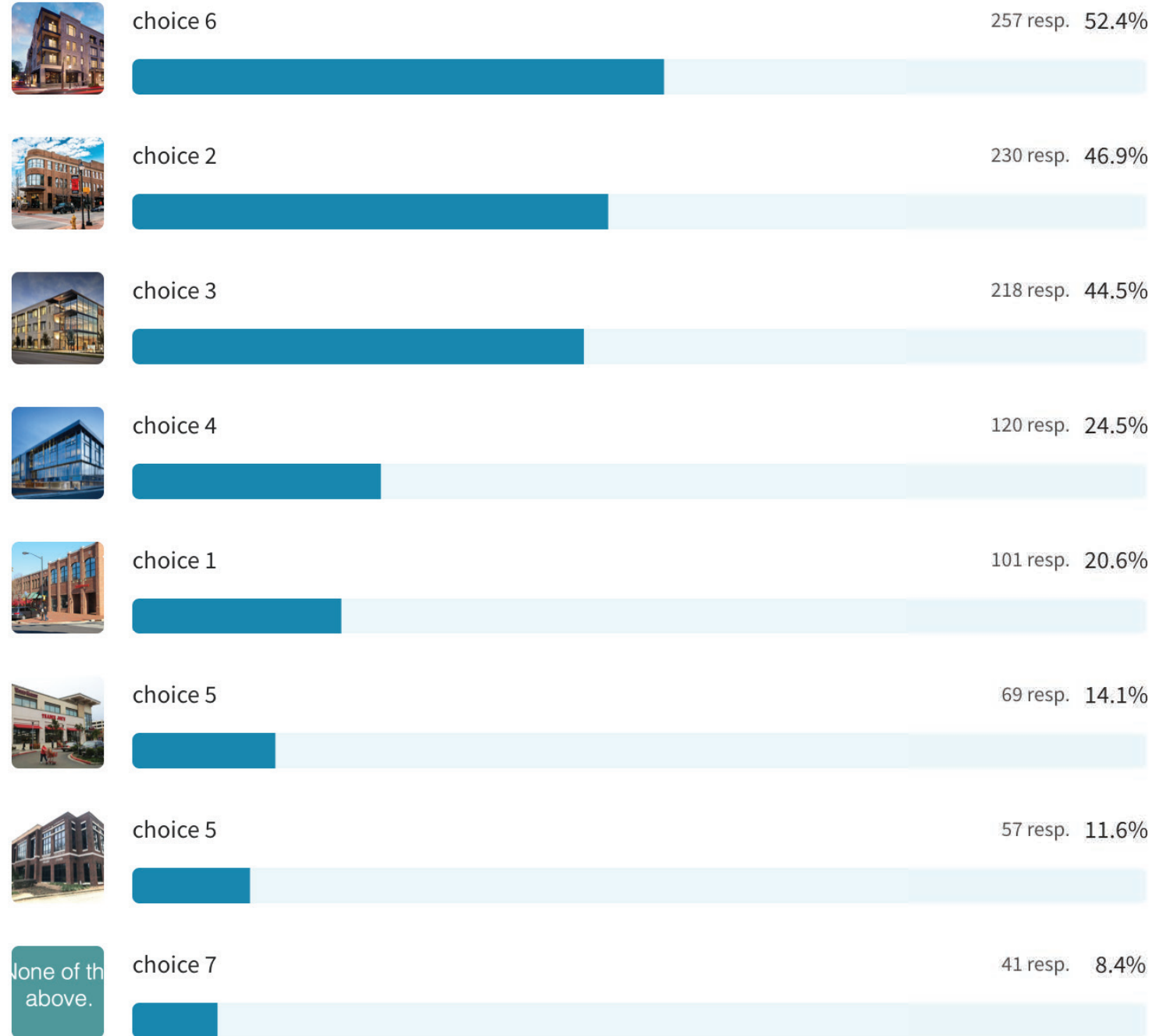

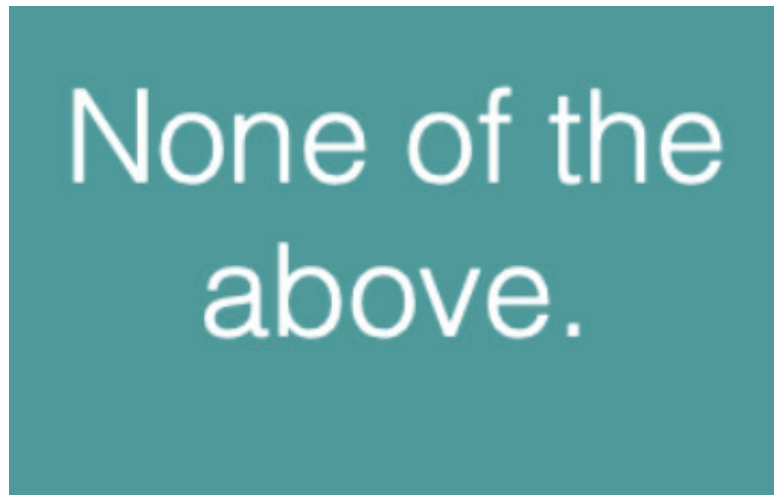
Top Three Choices

- building lighting as part of design element

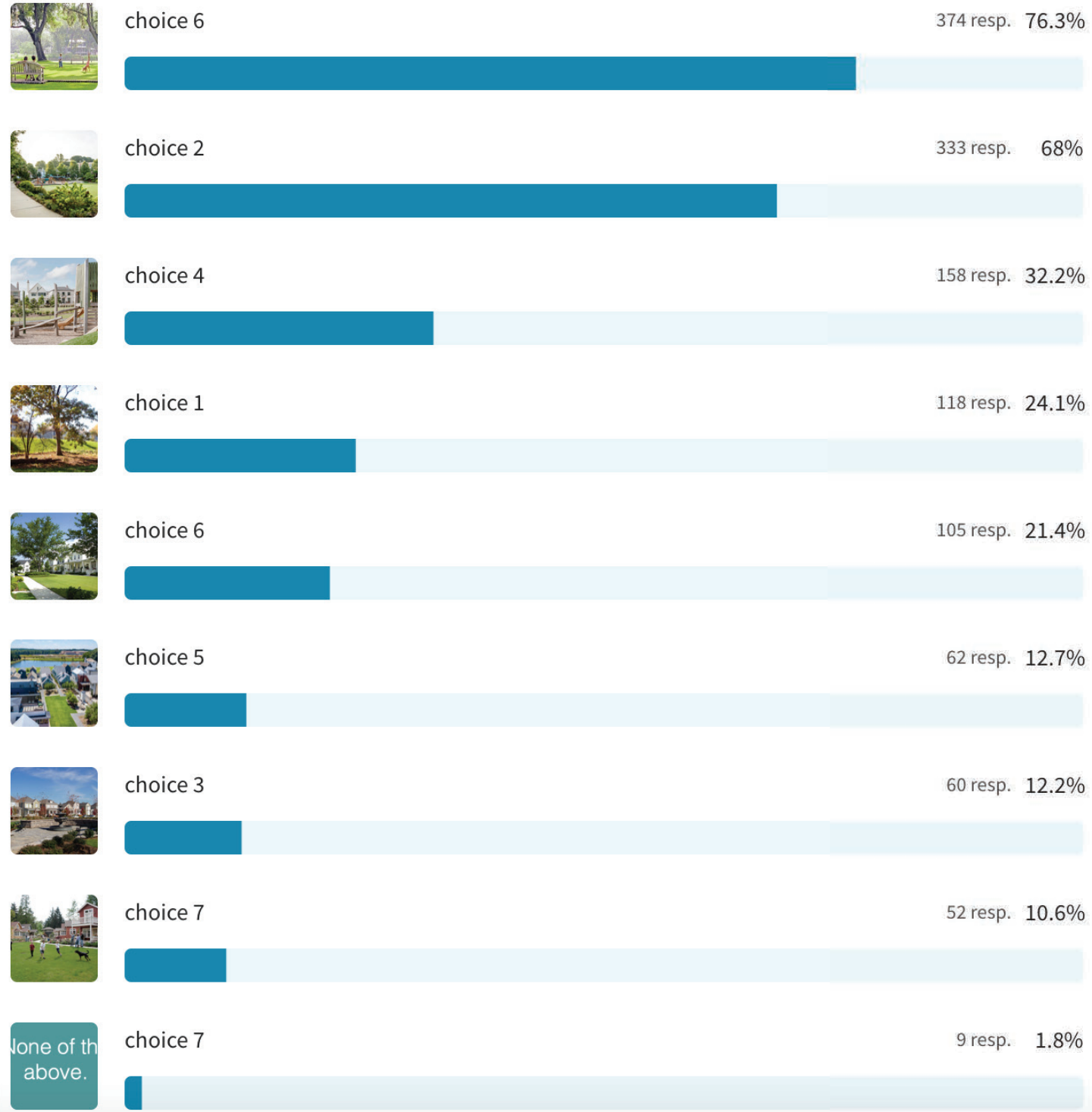

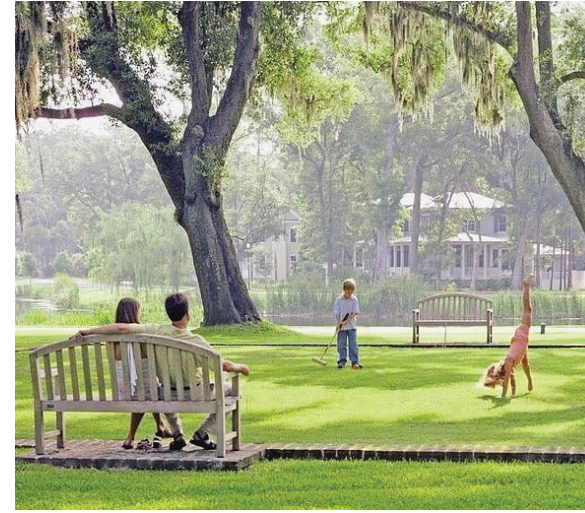
Neighborhood Parks and Green Spaces

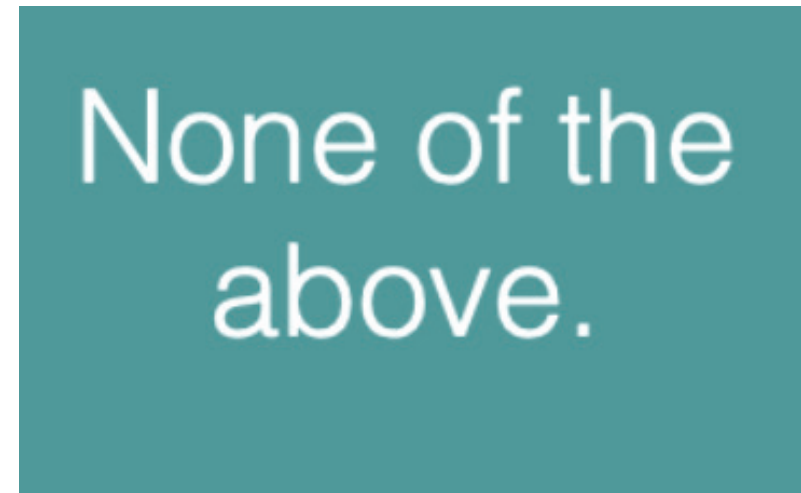
Top Three Choices

- edges of park space are defined by surrounding buildings or streets

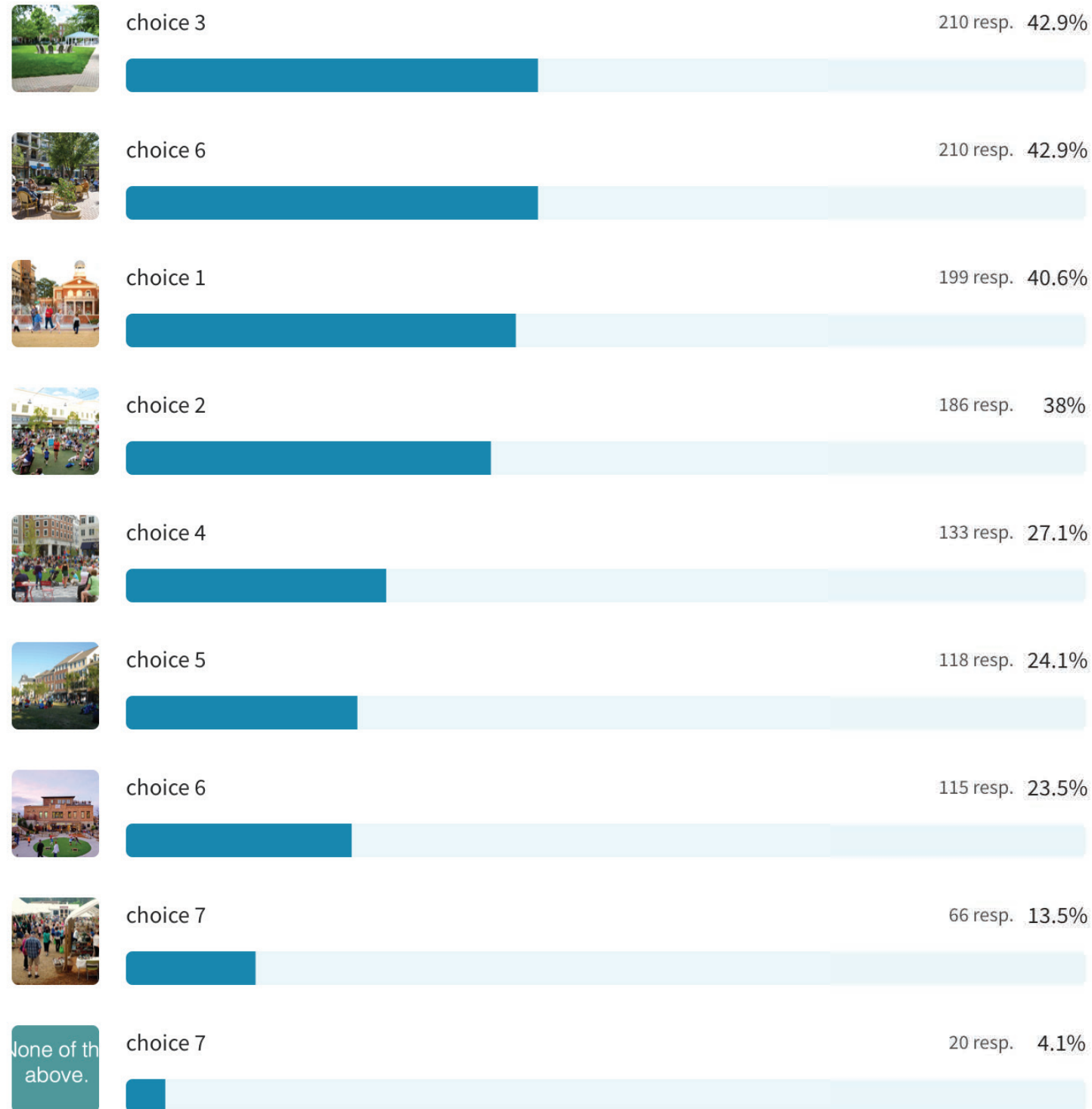

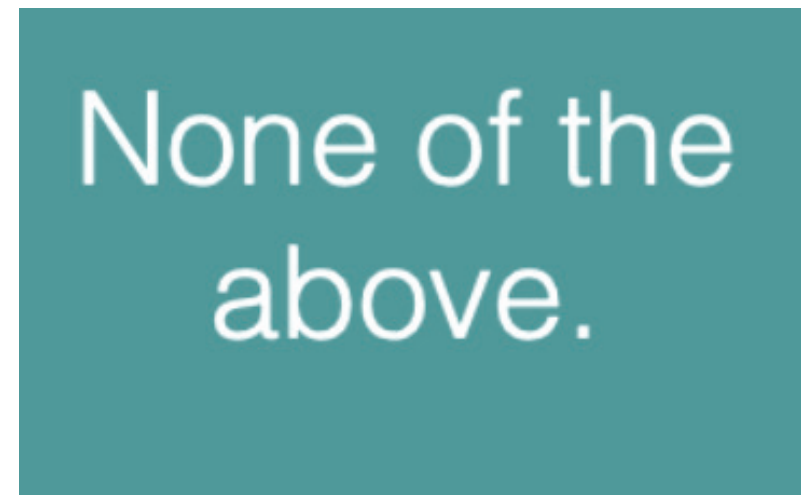
Top Three Choices

- edges of park space are defined by surrounding buildings with uses such as retail and restaurants

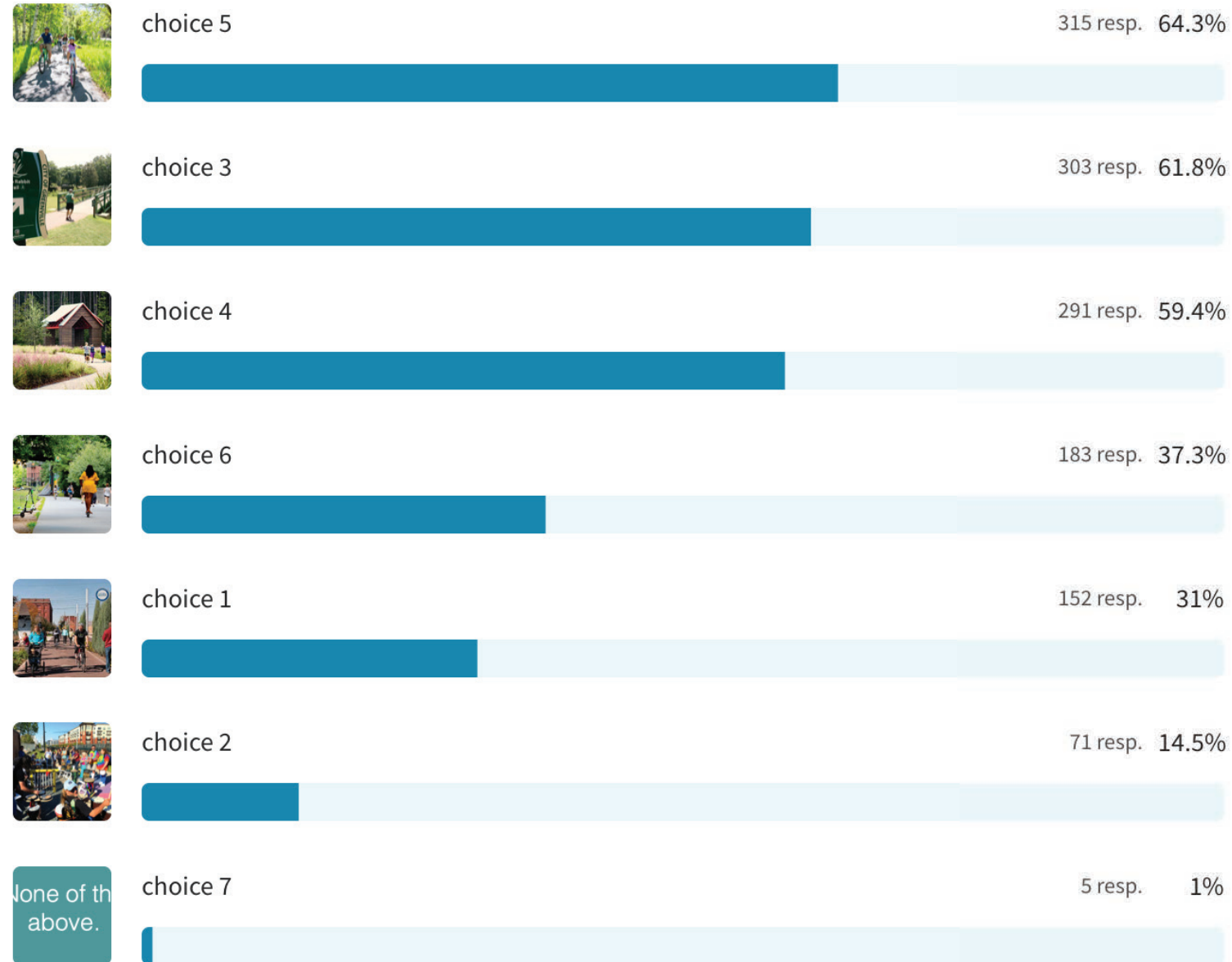

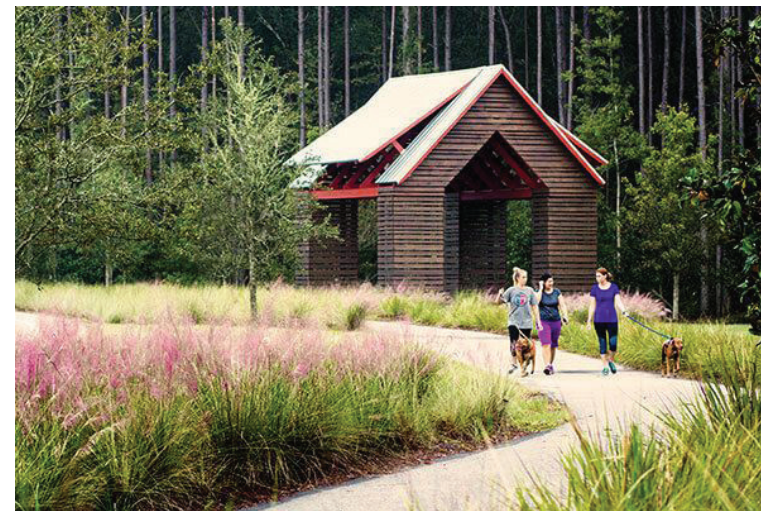
Greenways and Trails

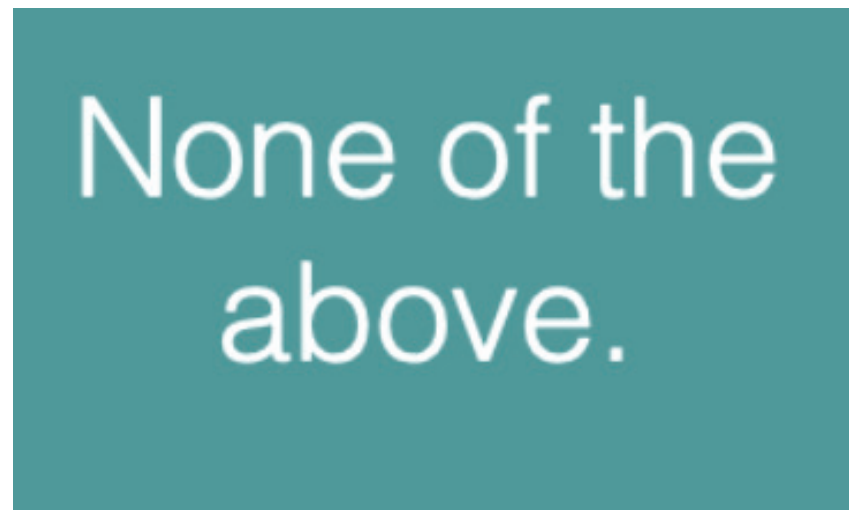
Top Three Choices

- directional signs and branded markers

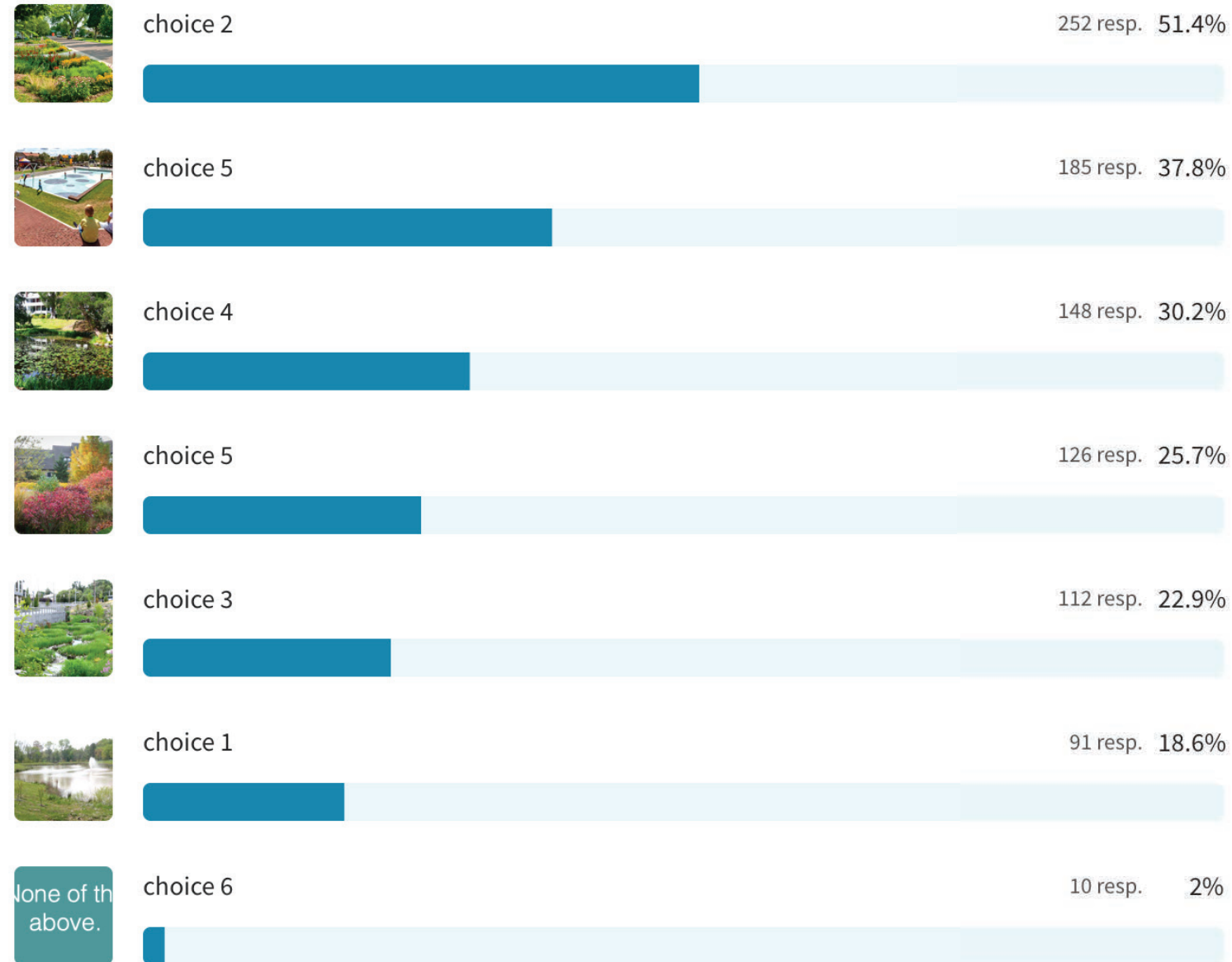

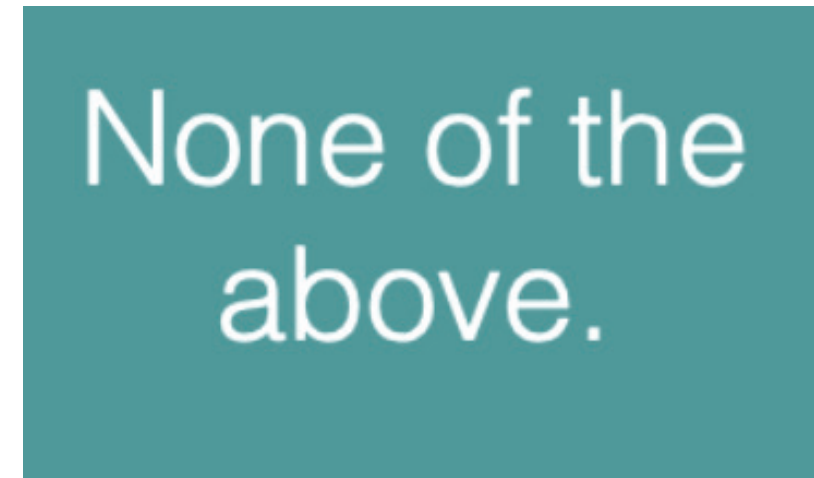
Top Three Choices

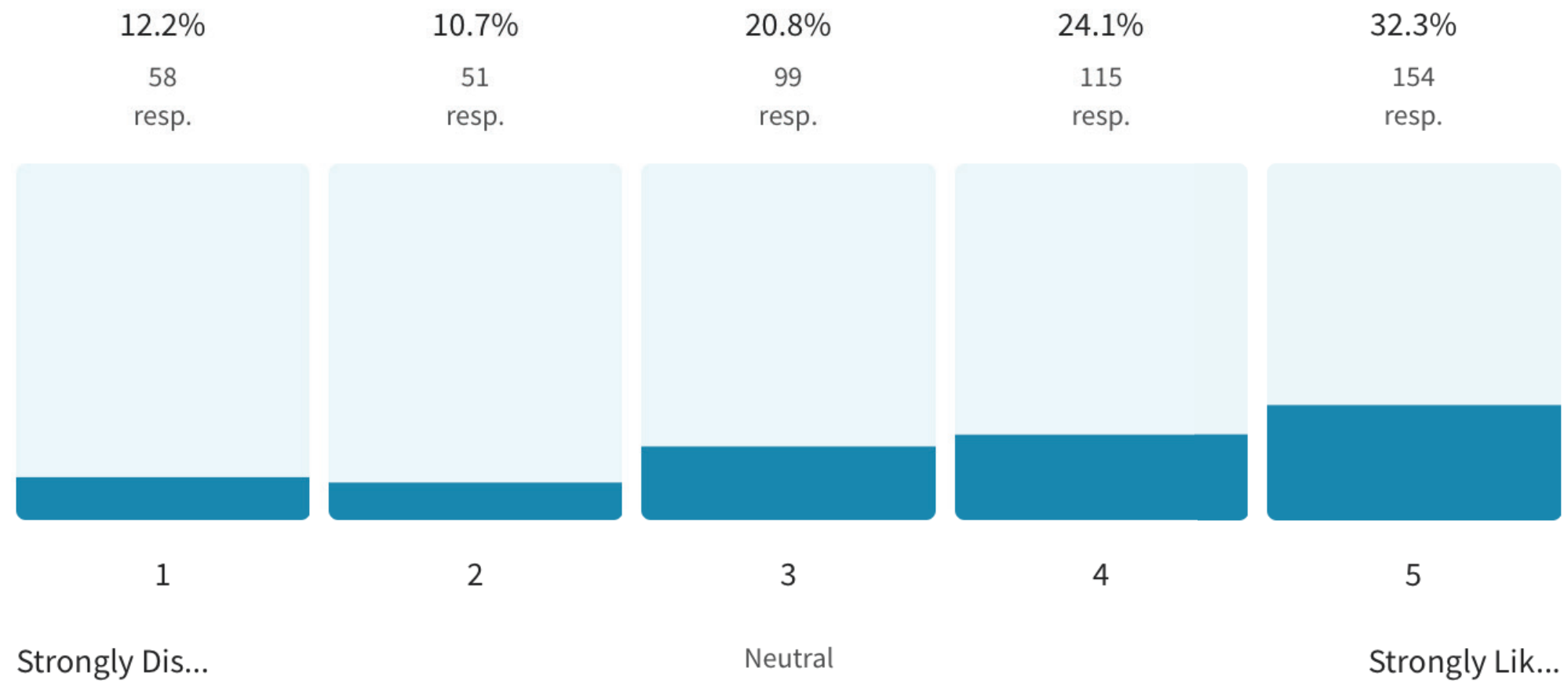




These are Woonerf streets, which function as a shared public spaces for pedestrians, cyclists, and slow-moving vehicles. Do you like or dislike this concept?

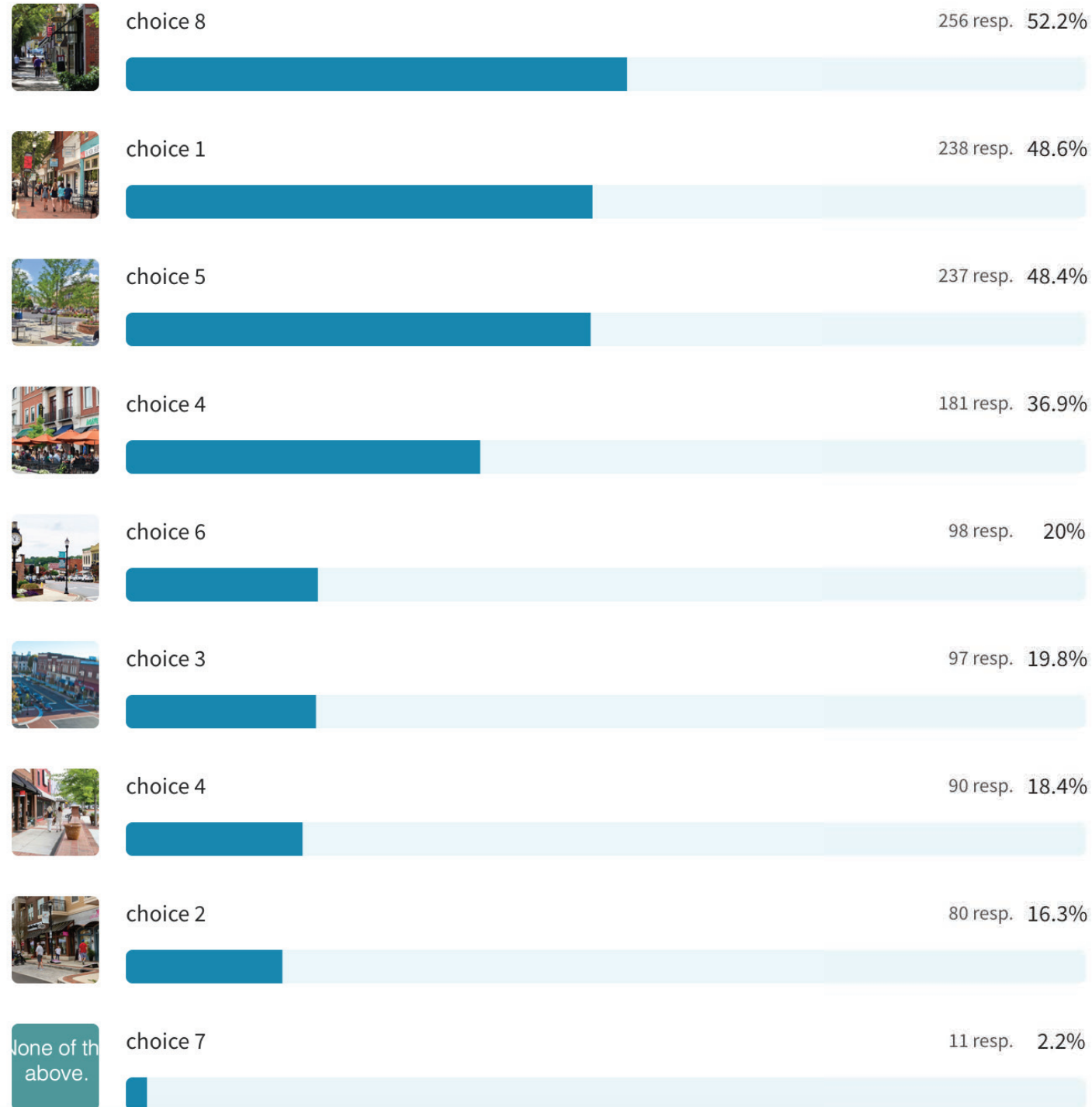

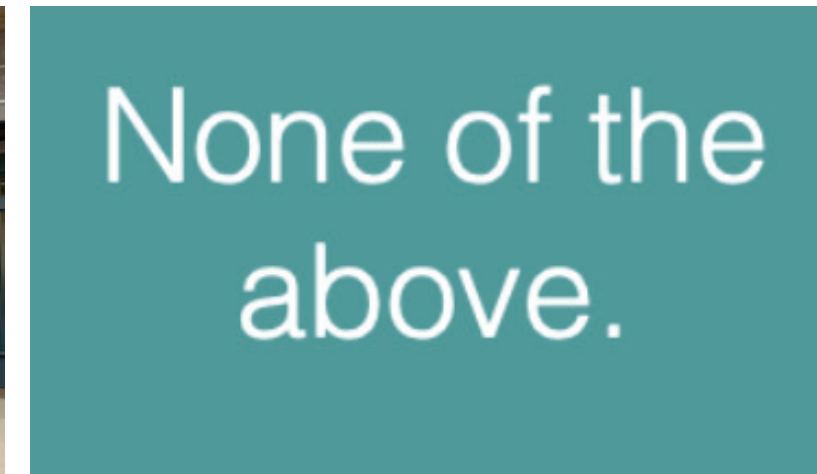
Top Three Choices

- engaging ground floor retail with large window areas

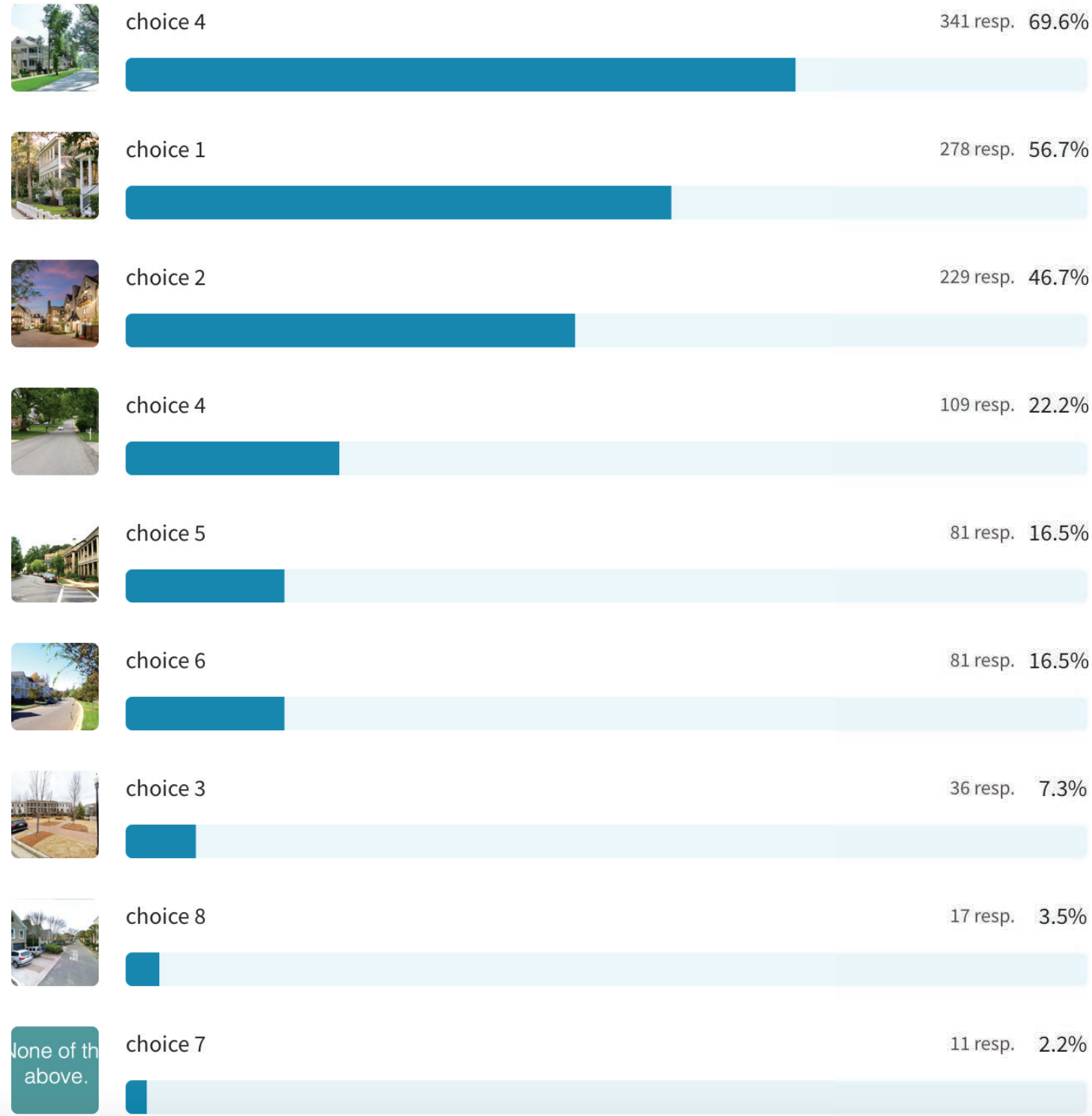

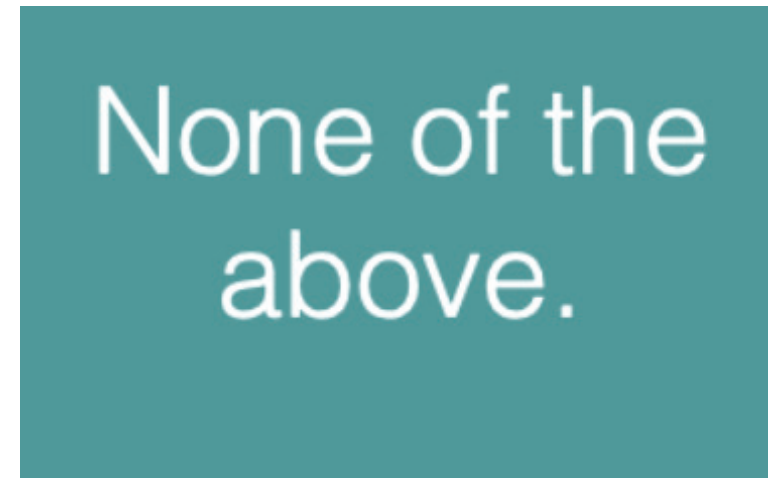
Top Three Choices

- two to three story residential buildings

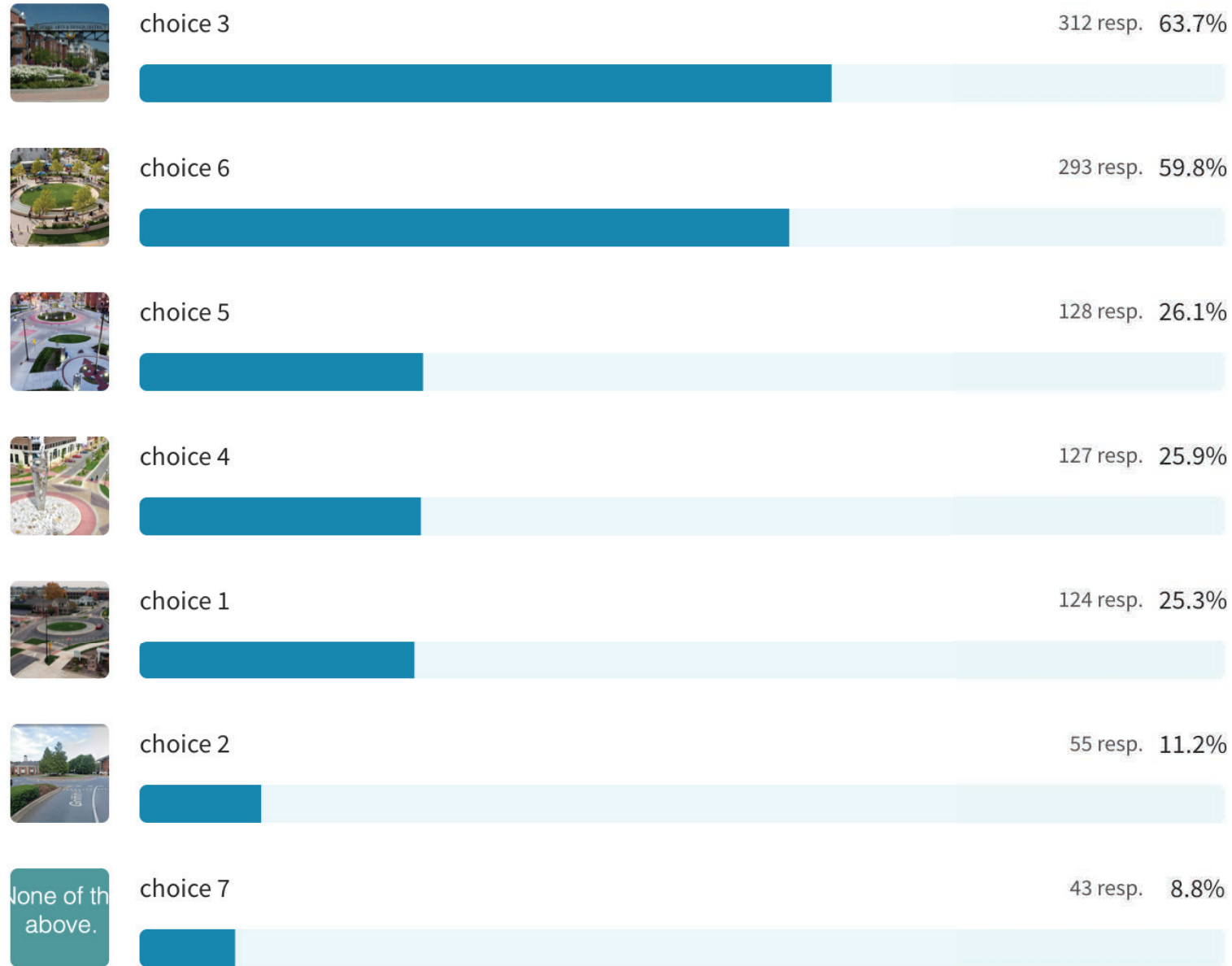

Observations

- roundabouts are framed by buildings
- roundabouts that are landscaped with grass, flowers and trees
- include water features such as fountains
- decorative paving used to separate it from roadway materials
- a part of a gateway/marker for the community
